My goal this summer is to let all of you know about the great resources available here at KAC (we're not just performing arts!) in hopes of creating some cohesion between the visual artists and the Arts Council. The Visual Arts Directory will serve as an email database to send out information and opportunities to you. Kodiak Arts Council is usually the first place people outside of Kodiak contact with artist calls, jobs, workshops, etc.

Also consider becoming a Member Organization of KAC. We would love to get the Visual Arts League (one of our most active member organizations in the 80s and 90s) back together. Becoming a member organization entitles you to the use of our non-profit status, use of the KAC raffle permit for fundraising, office support which includes a really nice color copier, and free adver-

tising on the KAC website and other KAC publications. So if you are already working with a group of other artists/people - even just casually to hold workshops or put on gallery shows, please consider becoming a member organization - it's a great resource.

Lastly, the Arts Council is holding a "Summer's End Art Exhibit" at the Kodiak College from August 27th to September 17th. You can bring up to four pieces - old or new - to be displayed and also for sale. This is meant to be a fun and no stress show; the venue is great and there is no commission for sold work - we just want to get the art out to the community. Also, let me know what you think about this time of year, as the KAC is trying to plan an annual art exhibit.

I also want to extend the invitation to come to the KAC Board meeting July 14th at 6:30 at the Auditorium to discuss the possibility of a wearable art show in Kodiak. I look forward to hearing back from you; any advice is greatly appreciated. I'm very excited (or maybe you call it naive :)) to make the visual artists a cohesive staple at the Arts Council. I know many of you have tried in the past, but let's remember why we all love art so much, and share that passion to the best of our abilities and resources in order to better our community.

Career Opportunity Grants are designed to provide financial assistance to professional artists for travel to in-state, national, or international events, programs or seminars and for other activities that will contribute to the strength of the artist's professional standing or skill. These cash awards help professional artists take advantage of impending, concrete opportunities that will significantly advance their work or careers. The awards are for unique, short-term opportunities that do not constitute routine completion of work in progress. Applicants may request grants in variable amounts from \$100 to \$1,000 rounded to the nearest \$100. Career Opportunity Grants will not exceed \$1,000. First time applicants must contact ASCA first.
